* Voluntary Consumables Charge - For those children in receipt of Free Entitlement Funding

This charge helps us to cover the costs of your children's breakfast, snacks, nappies, wipes and suncream whilst they are at Teddy Wilf's, which West Sussex County Council have made clear are not covered by the Free Entitlement Funding. The Voluntary Consumables Charge will be automatically added to your invoice and will equate to £2.50 per core session (AM and PM). In return we will provide all nappies, wipes, breakfast, snacks and suncream for children at Teddy Wilf's Nurseries.

If you would prefer not to pay the additional £2.50 per session then families will be welcome to provide the nappies, wipes, snacks, breakfast and suncream for their child – please just let our Head Office Team know so your invoice can be amended accordingly.

Important Information

Our pre-school is open from 8:30am - 3:30pm on Monday to Friday, 39 weeks per year during Term Time. Early Years Entitlement Funding can ONLY be used during Term Time. Full fees are payable during term time to maintain a child's place.

The Pre-School will close for 5 Continuing Professional Development Days during the year. Parents will not be charged for these days and Early Years Entitlement Funding will not be claimed on these days.

Financial Support for Parents

Local Authority 2 Year Funding – for eligible 2 year olds

If your family is in receipt of certain benefits, your child is adopted, under a Special Guardianship Order, receives Disability Living Allowance or has an EHCP then your child may be able to access 15 hours per week of free childcare during term time. Children are eligible from the term following their 2nd birthday (1st September, 1st January or 1st April). You must apply to West Sussex County Council for this funding and they will confirm your eligibility. Once you have been awarded this funding it cannot be removed, even if your circumstances change.

15 hour Early Years Entitlement Funding for Working Families – for eligible children from 9 months

If any Parents living in the household are working at least 16 hours per week at minimum wage, all year, then you are eligible for 15 hours per week during term time. Children are eligible from the term following them turning 9 months old (1st September, 1st January or 1st April). You will have to apply online for this funding via www.childcarechoices.gov.uk and they will confirm your eligibility. You will then need to log in and reconfirm your eligibility every 3 months otherwise you will lose the funding.

PLEASE NOTE From September 2025 the Early Years Entitlement Funding for eligible children from 9 months will increase from 15 hours per week during term time to 30 hours during term time. This is likely to lead to increased demand on places in the Early Years so we recommend contacting nurseries as soon as possible to secure your place.

15 hour Universal Early Years Entitlement Funding – for ALL 3 & 4 year olds

All children aged 3 or 4 years old are entitled to 15 hours per week of free childcare during term time. Children are eligible from the term following their 3rd birthday (1st September, 1st January or 1st April). You do not need to apply for this funding – we claim it on your behalf, we just need you to complete a 'Parent Declaration' which we will give you once your child is eligible.

15 hour Extended Early Years Entitlement Funding for Working Families – for eligible 3 & 4 year olds

If any Parents living in the household are working at least 16 hours per week at minimum wage, all year, then you are eligible for an additional 15 hours per week during term time, bringing the total to 30 hours per week. Children are eligible from the term following their 3rd birthday (1st September, 1st January or 1st April). You will have to apply online for this funding via www.childcarechoices.gov.uk and they will confirm your eligibility. You will then need to log in and reconfirm your eligibility every 3 months otherwise you will lose the funding.

Tax Free Childcare – for eligible children aged 0 – 11 years old - If you are working at least 16 hours per week at minimum wage, all year, and you are paying for childcare – the Government could help you by paying up to £2000 per year. For every £8.00 you pay into your Tax Free Childcare account, the Government will top it up by £2.00. *Please note, this cannot be used in conjunction with Universal Credit.*

Universal Credit – for eligible children aged 0 – 16 years old - If you are in receipt of Universal Credit, you could be entitled to support with your childcare costs. This is dependent on your individual circumstances but could be worth £ 1,031.88 per month for one child or £ 1,768.94 per month for two or more children.

Support Whilst you Study - There is various financial support for Parents who are studying (Care to Learn, Discretionary Learners Support and Childcare Grants) as well as financial support from individual learning providers (e.g. Chichester College will, in certain circumstances, help pay for childcare whilst you study).

IMPORTANT

Please don't forget that the Early Years Entitlement Funding for Working Families **MUST** be applied for a term in advance. Unfortunately, if families miss this deadline we will be unable to claim any funding for your child and you will either need to delay their start date or cover the cost of the childcare yourself.

Any claims for the Autumn Term must be made before midnight on the 31st August, claims for the Spring Term must be made before midnight on the 31st December and claims for the Summer Term must be made before midnight on the 31st March.
